# **U17AAA HEAD COACH**

#### **KEVIN RIEHL**

From starting his first strides in the small-town rink of Richmound, Saskatchewan, Kevin was able to pursue his love of the game further by joining the Medicine Hat minor hockey system. Those years helped propel him to advance to the WHL and play 4 seasons for the hometown Tigers. Kevin still holds the record for the most goals scored by a Medicine Hat Tiger at 199. Being drafted by the New Jersey Devils in 1991, Kevin went onto play 14 years of professional hockey in North America and Europe. After his playing career wrapped up, he returned to Medicine Hat with his family where he has coached for 15 years in our minor hockey system. A provincial championship at the U18 AA level has highlighted many successful years at that level and Kevin is determined to move the inaugural season of the U17 AAA in that same direction.

# **ASSISTANT COACHES**

#### JD GAETAN

JD was born and raised in Glace Bay, Nova Scotia where he played AAA hockey through to U18. He went on to play short stints in the Maritime Junior League and Collegiate hockey while attending the University of South Florida. After moving to Medicine Hat in 2007, JD was a part of SEAC's inaugural 2013/14 season as an assistant coach with what was then named the Midget 15 AAA team that captured provincial silver. From 2014-16 he was an assistant with the then named Midget 15 AAA team. In 2016 JD moved on to become head coach of the Medicine Hat Cubs for 4 seasons. Most recently, JD has worked alongside Kevin Riehl as an assistant coach with the U18AA program.

#### JOSEF HOLUBOWICH

Josef was born and raised in Fairview, Alberta before moving to Medicine Hat when he was 13 years old. He played 3 years in the SEAC program, one season at the then named Midget 15 AAA level and the following 2 seasons at the then named Midget AAA level. Following his minor hockey career, Josef stepped away from the game to pursue a career in golf course management and currently works as the assistant superintendent at the Medicine Hat Golf and Country Club. He returned back to hockey as an assistant coach with the U18AA program working alongside Kevin Riehl for the 2021-22 season.

Cody was born in Bracknell, England but was raised in Medicine Hat where he played his minor rep hockey until his graduation year. Following graduation Cody attended the University of Lethbridge and completed his degree while playing one season for the Coaldale Copperheads and Medicine Hat Cubs. Cody is excited to jump back into the hockey scene with his first season of coaching with the SEAC U17AAA program.

#### **MEGAN SEHN – ATHLETIC THERAPIST**

Megan was born and raised in Medicine Hat playing Volleyball and Fastball competitively. She began her BScKin with a minor in Human Psychology at MHC, transferring to University of Saskatchewan to complete her degree. ### **GOALTENDING COACH**

Matt Wong is entering his 15th season as a goaltending coach in Medicine Hat. Using his background in goaltending he founded King of the Crease Goaltending in 2009 after a successful Junior A career. He was a runner up for the Rookie of the Year in the AJHL and was twice named a BCHL All Star as a member of the Victoria Grizzlies and the Alberni Valley Bull Dogs.

Matt was the goaltending coach for the 2018-2019 RBC Cup Champion Brooks Bandits and is the Medicine Hat Tigers goaltending coach.

### **DRYLAND/FITNESS**

Template Fitness will be the home for all dryland training this season. Its highly qualified staff will work closely with all the SEAC athletes, coaches and trainers to maximize the potential for the players throughout the season. # FEE STRUCTURE

The following pages outline your financial commitment for participating in the SEAC program. Please note:

- Payment is expected <u>via Cheque only</u> and should be made out to SEAC or South East Athletic Club.
- Please reference your child's name on the cheque for ease of reference, specifically if the child's last name is different than your own.
- Tax deductible receipts cannot and will not be issued, as player fees are not a tax-deductible expense and SEAC is not a registered non-profit organization with the Canada Revenue Agency.
- Tournaments, exhibition, playoffs, and provincial expenses may require additional funding from the families, and this will be applied to the specific to the team or group.

### \*\*Important\*\*

 If payment is not received by the start of the season as requested below, player participation in SEAC activities may be suspended.

# 1. Fall Tryout

Registration Fees: (All players must register with MHMHA).

### 2. Pre-Season

Depending on the number of pre-season games and whether buses are used to traveling to road games, a pre-season fee may be collected from each player who has successfully extended his tryout and remains with a SEAC club past the Fall Tryout Camp. This fee will pay for the ice time, referees, travel costs, on-ice instruction, and any administrative costs related to pre-season games. The fee may vary between SEAC teams.

# 3. Regular Season Fees

All regular season fees as referenced below are due immediately upon your child earning a position on the team following the pre-season evaluations.

Upon making a SEAC team each Family / Player will need to make the following payments immediately:



All regular season fees, including the Player Fee and Performance Bond, as referenced below are due immediately upon a player earning a position on a team following the pre-season evaluations.

### **PLAYER FEES**

Player fees will cover the cost of ice time, travel, meals, and hotels for all players and coaching staff plus all other related costs associated with running the hockey team.

Upon making a SEAC team, each player's parents will need to make the following payments for player fees:

**U17 AAA Program:** \$6,250 per annum (4 x \$1562.50) **U15 AAA Program:** \$6,250 per annum (4 x \$1562.50) **U15 AA Program:** \$5,000 per annum (4 x \$1250.00)

Payments are due and payable in 4 equal installments <u>via Cheque only</u> postdated for October 1<sup>st</sup>, November 1<sup>st</sup>, December 1<sup>st</sup> and January 1<sup>st</sup>.

SEAC has decided that a player/family is able to use all sponsorship monies raised towards their own individual fees. For those of you interested in finding sponsors this could help you immensely and, indeed, could pay for all of a player's fees. For those of you that would just rather pay for the fee this does not affect you. Please understand there will be no hard copy of the program this year with the same provided and represented online. Tax deductible receipts will not be issued for sponsorships as SEAC is not a registered non-profit organization with the Canada Revenue Agency. Sponsors are encouraged to seek their own accounting advice as whether and how their sponsorship can be a tax-deductible expense with the Canada Revenue Agency.

### PERFORMANCE BOND

SEAC receives vital support from the Medicine Hat Tigers 50/50 program, which allows us to relieve the financial commitment for each SEAC individual player. Each family is required to work a number of scheduled shifts at Medicine Hat Tigers home games. A \$200 Performance Bond guarantees the parent's commitment to this program and allows us to uphold and respect this strong relationship.

Parents are submit their Performance Bond on a <u>separate Cheque only</u> postdated for November 1<sup>st</sup>. This cheque will only be cashed if the family is unable fulfill their commitment to work their designated 50/50 shift or make a



suitable arrangement for a replacement worker. Upon such circumstance, another \$200 Performance Bond becomes due.

### PLAYER BILLETING

Should a family require Billeting for their player, please coordinate with your Team Manager. Each family is responsible for a \$500/monthly payment provided directly to the host family.

### **EQUIPMENT**

All SEAC teams are expected to wear similar gloves, pants and helmets and this cost is the responsibility of each player.

Each player will be provided a hoodie, work out clothing and a hockey bag.

### REIMBURSEMENT OF PLAYER FEES

We understand there are circumstances in our lives that may result in our decision for change. SEAC has determined that any player leaving our program voluntarily will not be entitled to a reimbursement of their player fees if this change occurs after December 1<sup>st</sup>.

If a player is injured for the season in the first few months of the year, a reimbursement of player fees may be prorated, specifically if the parents confirm their child's spot can be provided to another player.

After January 1<sup>st</sup> no player fees refund will apply to injured players.
